### TRANSCRIPTS

2. Applicants are required to submit a current, high school transcript. Please include your high school transcript with your completed application for efficient processing.
3. If you are seeking transfer credit, you must have an official transcript sent from each college you attended. Contact your college Records or Registrar's Office and ask that your transcript be sent to our Records Office. You may be asked to submit your request in writing along with a transcript fee. Transcripts not received directly from a college must be received in a sealed college envelope. To request an official evaluation of your transcript(s), contact Assessment Services at 610-359-5322 and request a petition for transfer credit. Complete the petition and return it to Assessment Services immediately. We recommend visiting students submit official transcripts and transfer their credits to make registering for classes, especially online, easier.

### PLACEMENT TEST, ADVISING AND COURSE REGISTRATION

4. After we receive your completed application, we will send you "Next Steps" letter with information about placement testing. The test takes 2½ hours.  
SAT or ACT scores may be used for placement in math and/or English courses. Students should have their official scores sent to Assessment Services at the College. The College's school code for the SAT is 2125 and for the ACT is 3542. Scores must be current within 5 years of the student starting classes. To waive the placement test, students must receive the following minimum scores:  
**English/Reading** = SAT verbal: 500; ACT verbal: 18      **Math** = SAT math: 500; ACT math: 20

If you have eligible scores please send a copy or screen shot of your scores with your application. Copy must include name and date of test.
